

April 30, 2021 Message to Duncaster Residents and Families Michael A. O'Brien, President and CEO

The COVID-19 news in Connecticut continues to be encouraging. Connecticut reported its lowest COVID-19 positivity rate and fewest number of new cases in more than six months. In addition, hospitalizations continue to decrease. These are all very favorable trends and are monitored closely as we continue to reopen our community and ease restrictions.

Testing

Main Building

All staff members in the Main Building tested negative this week. All Independent Living residents tested negative on April 28th. All Assisted Living Residents (Thistle Way/Talcott Notch) tested negative this week.

Caleb Hitchcock Health Center

All staff are negative from this week's testing. All Dogwood Assisted Living residents are negative. Caleb Hitchcock Health Center residents were not tested this week as they are not in outbreak mode which requires weekly testing.

Effective immediately, DPH is changing the weekly testing requirements for the Caleb Hitchcock Health Center as follows:

- Fully vaccinated staff do not need to be tested weekly any more. They would need to be tested if they are symptomatic or have had a high risk exposure.
- Unvaccinated staff must be tested weekly.
- If in outbreak mode, all staff and residents need to be tested, PCR within 3 days and then 3 to 7 days after until no positive for 14 days.

Vaccination Status

At this time 99.5% of all residents are fully vaccinated. For staff 78% of our full time staff members are fully vaccinated.

Caleb Hitchcock Health Center-Visitation

The Federal Government and CDC have opened visitation in nursing homes after a year of no visitors being allowed. To the extent that visitors and the resident are vaccinated, the new guideline states that they can visit without a mask and not distance. This is great news for our residents that are all fully vaccinated and their families. Visitation may take place without masking and without social distancing under the following circumstances:

- Both the resident and the visitor(s) are fully vaccinated.
- The resident and visitor(s) are alone in the resident's room or a designated visiting space where no one else is present.
- The visitor must mask and social distance from all other residents, staff, and visitors while in the nursing home.
- If a resident or any of the resident's visitors are not fully vaccinated, or if other residents, staff or visitor groups are present, masking and social distancing should be maintained throughout the visit.
- Nursing homes are not expected to obtain proof of vaccination of visitors, such as photo copies of vaccination cards. Asking a visitor about vaccination status is sufficient for determining masking and social distancing protocols during the visit.

Caleb Hitchcock Health Center-Activities and Dining

To the extent that staff conducting the group activity and all residents in the activity are vaccinated, they can be within 6 feet of one another and will not need to mask. After a year of no group activities, this is welcoming news for our residents and our life enrichment staff. Activities and dining may take place without masking and without social distancing under the following circumstances:

- All individuals present in the activity or dining area, including all residents, staff, and visitors, are fully vaccinated.
- If any individuals are present in the activity or dining area that are not fully vaccinated, masking and social distancing should be maintained throughout the activity and dining (masks may be removed when actively eating) for all individuals regardless of vaccination status.
- Vaccination status should be determined in a way that maintains the individual's privacy and dignity. CDC recommends asking residents, staff, and

visitors to sign up for activities / dining ahead of time so that vaccination status can be determined and appropriate decisions made. If vaccination status is unknown, protocols for "unvaccinated" individuals should be followed.

- Nursing homes are permitted to "cohort" activities and dining according to vaccination status. If choosing to do so, the nursing home must continue to comply with Resident Rights requirements.
- Staff may additionally follow the above guidance on masking and social distancing when in break rooms or in-person meetings. If all individuals present are fully-vaccinated, all individuals may forego masking and social distancing.

Thank you again for all you do to keep our community safe, for wearing your mask and for social distancing. While we are currently COVID-19 free we must continue to be strong and vigilant.
